Pet Holiday Safety!

Keeping our furry friends safe over the next few weeks will ensure they enjoy the fun around the holidays, without any scares.

Mistletoe, holly, and poinsettias are poisonous to dogs. If you have these plants in your home for the holidays, be sure to keep them in a place where your pup cannot get to them.

Avoid any edible tree decorations. Popcorn and cranberry strings can be tempting to your pet, and with a few good tugs can pull your tree down. Oh no!

Although tinsel can be a beautiful addition to the tree, be sure to hang it out of your pet's reach. If ingested, tinsel can cause intestinal blockage, which may need to be removed surgically.

Now, let's talk trees. Pine needles, if ingested, can puncture intestines. If you are bringing a live tree into your home, keep the dogs away from the needles. Check online for cute and festive ideas to block pets away from the tree.

These simple tips can help keep the holidays fun for all, and keep your pets out of harms way.

Top 10 Tips from PetMD

- 1. Put the tree in the corner
- 2. Keep tinsel away from dogs
- 3. Keep lights off lower branches
- 4. Keep tempting ornaments up high
- 5. Clean up the pine needles
- 6. Keep poisonous plants out of reach
- 7. Omit the popcorn strings
- 8. Burn candles up high to avoid wagging tails and curious noses
- 9. Tape down wires
- 10. Put away wrapping materials and utensils
