
#### ◇ FAMILY:



## Knowing First Aid can save your Dog's life!

### In Memory of Kassie

Too few dog owners know what to do in case of an emergency with their pet. All pet owners should have a working knowledge of first aid and CPR should an emergency arise.

It is important to know what is normal for your dog...how he usually walks, sleeps, eats, urinates, etc. Simple procedures like checking the health of his gums, taking his pulse and knowing his normal heart rate is valuable information to a vet in an emergency.

Helpful first-aid techniques:



#### CHECKING THE GUMS

Healthy gums are pink and moist. Pale, white or blue gums can signal a problem such as shock or anemia, which is a low-red cell count.

The best way to check is to lift up your dog's muzzle and press lightly with your finger on the gum area above the canine tooth...it should return to a pink color within a couple seconds.

#### TAKING THE PULSE

The number of heart beats per minute varies by size, with larger dogs having a slower rate. It is good to know your dog's normal rate...if it is usually 80 and now is 150, that can mean he is in trouble. To take your dog's pulse, lay him on his RIGHT side. Then follow

these steps:

- Gently lift his upper hind leg away from the lower hind leg.
- Place two fingers as high up as possible on the inside of the leg where the leg meets the body.
- Feel for a recess in the middle of the leg about halfway between the front and back. This is where the blood vessels are located and you will find the pulse.
- Count the number of pulses in 10 seconds and multiply that number by six to give you beats per minute.



### Saving your pet with CPR

With pets increasingly being treated like a member of the family, many owners are learning emergency techniques like CPR to keep their pet alive before bringing it to a veterinarian.

**Check for breathing and pulse**  
Check pulse using middle and index finger below the arched, inner thigh (femoral artery), below the arched or where left elbow touches the chest.

**Look for other warning signs**  
- Gums and lips will appear gray, colored.  
- Pupils will be dilated and not responsive to light.

**If not breathing, give breath to animal**  
Cats and small dogs: Place your mouth over its nose and mouth to blow air in.  
Medium-large dogs: Place your mouth over its head to blow air in.

**Heimlich maneuver**  
If breath won't go in, airway may be blocked. Turn dog upside down, with its back against your chest. Wrap your arms around the dog and clasp your hands together just below its rib cage (where you're holding the dog upside down, it's about the 10 o'clock, in the abdomen). Using both arms, give five sharp thrusts to the abdomen. Then, check its mouth or airway for the blockage. If you see it, remove it and give two more rescue breaths.

**Start compressions if no pulse**  
Lay animal on right side and place hand over ribs where its elbow touches the chest. Begin compressions. Do not give compressions if dog has pulse.

Animal size	Compress per breath of chest	Compressions per breath of air
Small dog (under 30 lbs.)	1-2 inches	5
Medium-large dog (30-90 lbs.)	1-3 inches	5
Great dog (over 90 lbs.)	1-3 inches	10

**Repeat procedure**  
- Check pulse after 1 minute and then every five minutes.  
- Continue giving CPR until the animal has a pulse AND is breathing.  
- Stop CPR after 20 minutes.

## First Aid (con't)

### STOPPING BLEEDING IN A WOUND

If your dog is bleeding due to a cut or a bite.....experts say, "Don't worry, dogs have more blood than you think". Put pressure on the wound, but do not take it off to see if the bleeding has stopped. If you don't have a first-aid kit handy.....a towel and duct tape work well. If you are able to treat the wound, it is better to not use peroxide to clean it. Peroxide is bad for wounds as it delays healing. A better alternative would be to use sterile saline solution or tap water.



### HELPING A DOG THAT IS CHOKING

If your dog is choking on food or a toy and is conscious, approach him cautiously to avoid being bitten. Open his mouth and carefully sweep the inside with your finger to dislodge the object. Pull the tongue forward. If you can't dislodge the object, you will need to perform these abdominal thrusts:




--- If you can lift your dog, hoist him by his front legs with his spine against your chest and wrap your arms around him under his ribs. Make a fist and give five rapid abdominal thrusts, lifting your fist in an inward and upward motion. Just be gentle, as you would working on a baby.

--- If your dog is too big to lift, place him on his side. Put the palms of your hands below his rib cage and give five rapid abdominal thrusts in an inward and upward motion.

--- Check his mouth to see if the object has been dislodged.

### CHECKING BREATHING IN AN UNCONSCIOUS DOG

Place your hand on the dog's side to see if the chest is moving up and down. If your dog isn't breathing, place your mouth over his muzzle if he weighs more than 30 pounds. Seal his entire snout with your mouth if he weighs less than 30 pounds and gently exhale until you see the chest rise. Give four or five breaths rapidly and then check to see if your dog is breathing without assistance.



## A Note From the Editor

My newsletter book recommendation is ["Inside of a Dog: What Dogs See, Smell, and Know"](#) by Alexandra Horowitz. This is a little heavier read than usual, but I found it fascinating.

[From Amazon:](#) The answers will surprise and delight you as Alexandra Horowitz, a cognitive scientist, explains how dogs perceive their daily worlds, each other, and that other quirky animal, the human. Horowitz introduces the reader to dogs' perceptual and cognitive abilities and then draws a picture of what it might be like to be a dog. What's it like to be able to smell not just every bit of open food in the house but also to smell sadness in humans, or even the passage of time? How does a tiny dog manage to play successfully with a Great Dane? What is it like to hear the bodily vibrations of insects or the hum of a fluorescent light? Why must a person on a bicycle be chased? What's it like to use your mouth as a hand? In short, what is it like for a dog to experience life from two feet off the ground, amidst the smells of the sidewalk, gazing at our ankles or knees? *Inside of a Dog* explains these things and much more. The answers can be surprising—once we set aside our natural inclination to anthropomorphize dogs. *Inside of a Dog* also contains up-to-the-minute research—on dogs' detection of disease, the secrets of their tails, and their skill at reading our attention—that Horowitz puts into useful context. Although not a formal training guide, *Inside of a Dog* has practical application for dog lovers interested in understanding why their dogs do what they do. With a light touch and the weight of science behind her, Alexandra Horowitz examines the animal we think we know best but may actually understand the least. This book is as close as you can get to knowing about dogs without being a dog yourself.


