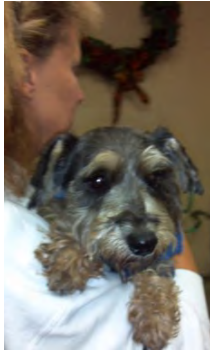

SRC/F Rescue Operations

When a Miniature Schnauzer or Schnauzer Mix is rescued by SRC/F, we become responsible for the dog until it is adopted. We evaluate each Schnauzer and work with the dog, according to its needs, including:

- Complete physical exam by licensed veterinarian.
 - All vaccinations, including rabies are brought up to date.
 - Dogs are checked for parasites including heartworm.
 - Dental care as required is provided.
 - Illnesses or medical problems are treated.
- During foster care, we provide monthly heartworm, flea prevention and any necessary medications. Fosters evaluate our Schnauzers for behavior and social traits which aids in finding that match for their forever home.
- All dogs are spayed or neutered before adoption.



Foster Homes - a loving caring step prior to adoption

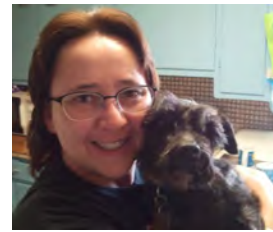
While in our care, rescued Schnauzers live in loving and caring environments until they are ready- both physically and emotionally - to move into their forever homes. Foster parents spend many hours socializing, housebreaking and teaching them basic commands.



SRC/F is always looking for Volunteers

SRC/F is always looking for additional volunteers who can provide foster homes for our Schnauzers. When SRC/F foster homes are full, we are unable to continue our rescue efforts so we can never have too many fosters volunteers. Our foster volunteers are not compensated in any way other than the satisfaction that they have saved a Schnauzer and contributed to a new life of love and caring for each rescued dog, and the joy of watching these pups flourish under their care.



How to adopt a Schnauzer from SRC/F

All Adopters must complete an application that provides information used by SRC/F to thoroughly screen all prospective owners. This ensures that every dog will go to an adoptive home that meets our adoption criteria. Adopted Schnauzers must be kept current on vaccines and heartworm prevention. They must be inside family pups exclusively and not left outside. If an adopter is unable to keep an adopted Schnauzer, the dog must be returned to SRC/F. They cannot be sold, traded or disposed of in any way.
